



Dear Parents, Family, and Friends,

My name is Justin Berk, and I am a Meteorologist and professor at Stevenson University in Baltimore, MD. Wind for Change is a classroom education program and fundraiser I started in 2010 as a way to engage kids in science, while raising money for a great cause at the same time.



I will be visiting your child's classroom in about two weeks.

The exact date of my visit can be found on the second page. Prior to my visit, I ask the classroom teachers to send home some information on how exactly Wind for Change works. I find that the kids get really into the competition (no matter the age or grade), and those who didn't understand how to sign up are disappointed they can't participate.

How does Wind For Change work?

At the conclusion of my science lesson, I will invite the students who brought in pledge sheets up to the front of the class. Each student will get two chances to blow the highest wind speed they can into my hand-held anemometer (pictured right). At the conclusion of my visit, each student's pledge sheet is filled in and the class total tallied and announced. Funds are due to back to the teacher a week following my visit. Where does the money raised go?

100% of Wind For Change fundraising dollars go to the **Cool Kids Campaign Learning Center**. Cancer treatments render a child's immune system too weak to attend school with their classmates. This remarkable program allows children to stay current with their grade level and interact with peers going through similar medical treatments. What does the winner of the competition get?

There are two categories in this competition: highest recorded wind speed and most money fundraised. At the end of each semester (i.e. twice each school year), the top students in each category will be awarded a pizza party for their entire science class!
